St Peter's basilica

This is the heart of the Vatican city and this is also known as the world's largest Basilica of Christianity. Therefore, the total area is 186 meters of length and 46 meters of the center. In the main dome, the diameter is 42 meters large and 136 meter high. The capacity of this Basilica is 20,000 people can pray in here. In addition, inside of the basilica decorated by a ten thousand square meters of mosaics, which use for showing the meaning of the wall and floor. One of the famous artist in the Italian High Renaissance is Michelangelo who was a sculpture and painter, and he also made the finest work in sculpture as "Pieta" in his early age. Michelangelo's pieta is now become part of the study of the Italian High Renaissance. This sculpture is located in this Basilica.

Weather

The Sistine Chapel

The chapel has played an important part in the life of the Vatican. It also known as the famous Sistine chapel that has Michelangelo's painting on the ceiling called the Last Judgement. It painted on the alter wall completes the most powerful cycle of painting in the western world. After this painting, Michelangelo became a great painter and no one has come close to his scale technic, technical skill and composition of the art work.

Raphael Room

The four rooms known as the Stanze of Raphael form part of the apartment situated on the second floor of the Pontifical Palace that was chosen by Julius II della Rovere, the Pope. as his own residence and used also by his successors. The picturesque decoration was carried out by Raphael and his pupils between 1508 and 1524.

New Wing

the opportunity was taken to build a new section for classical sculpture. Pope Pius VII (1800-1823) employed the Roman architect Raffaele Stern to build what is now called the New Wing (Braccio Nuovo) of the Chiaramonti Museum.

Chiaramonti Museum

In this museum aimed to display the "three sister arts" together: sculpture, in the antique works exhibited; architecture, in the corbels obtained from ancient architectonic cornices; and painting, in frescoes.

Pio Clementino Museum

The museum fills several large exhibition halls which were obtained by adapting pre-existing rooms with new constructions both within and adjacent to the small Belvedere Palace of Innocent VIII (1484-92). Antique sculpture was brought here and ancient roman pieces have often had their missing parts completely restored. The neo-classical architecture was realised under the direction of Alessandro Dori, Michelangelo Simonetti, and Giuseppe Camporese and embellished by the work of a large number of painters and decorators.



Weather Table

Its average annual temperature is above 68 °F during the day and 50 °F at night.

In the coldest month – January, the average temperature is 54 °F during the day and 37 °F at night. |

In the warmest months – July and August, the average temperature is 86 °F during the day and 64 °F at night.

December, January and February are the coldest months, with average temperatures around 54.5 °F during the day and 38.5 °F at night. Temperatures generally vary between 10 and 15 °C (50 and 59 °F) during the day and between 3 and 5 °C (37 and 41 °F) at night

Vatican Garden

The Vatican Gardens have been a place of quiet and meditation for the popes since 1279 when Nicholas III (Giovanni Gaetano Orsini, 1277-1280) moved his residence back to the Vatican from the Lateran Palace. Within the new walls, which he had built to protect his residence, he planted an orchard (pomerium), a lawn (pratellum) and a garden (viridarium). The event is recorded among other places on a stone plaque which can be viewed in the "Sala dei Capitani" of the "Palazzo dei Conservatori" on Rome's Capitoline Hill. Created around the hill of Saint Egidio (where the "Palazzetto del Belvedere" is located today) and the courtyards of the Vatican Museums, this was to be the first garden in the Vatican. However, should you visit the Vatican Gardens today you would begin by viewing a totally different area from that first orchard, one located in a more recent addition to what is now Vatican City State. It is there that larger and more recent gardens have been planted, covering together with the original garden about half of the 44 hectares of Vatican City.

Castel Sant' Angelo

This Fortress was built as a mausoleum for the Emperor Hadrian (AD130-139), but it has also been a prison and a papal residence. It was used by former Popes who absconded there for protection in times of danger. There has been a covered passageway which still connects Castel Sant'Angelo to the Vatican.

The National Museum of Castel Sant'Angelo inside retraces its history. The castle has various exhibits ranging from Renaissance paintings and pottery to antique military weapons. A huge spiral ramp ascends upwards the Castel Sant'Angelo for about 400 feet.

As in the last act of Tosca, admire the beautiful view from the terrace but don't throw yourself off - go for a coffee instead in one of the rampart towers.
